

LAWRENCEBURG TROUNCES SPARTA, 6 TO 0

Webb Leads Way to Lone Touchdown

Winner Qualifies To Meet Shelbyville on Saturday

MURFREESBORO, Tenn., Nov. 29—(Spl)—Lawrenceburg weaved a Webb—surname, Zollie—around and over Sparta here late this afternoon to score a 6 to 0 triumph and step forward into the Mid-State playoff finals and a game Saturday against Shelbyville.

The battle waged on State Teachers field before approximately 4,000 fans, was devoid of thrills and exclusive of the final five minutes was strictly a defensive affair.

The Wildcats capitalized on a break midway of the final period to record the marginal points.

Sub Halfback West of Sparta fumbled and D. L. Pettus, Wildcat reserve back, recovered on the Warrior's 32.

WEBB TAKES CHARGE

Webb personally assumed charge at this juncture and inaugurated a touchdown movement.

He rapped right tackle for three and followed up with a center rush for a first down on the 21.

Bill Willard dented left guard for two and Webb jumped back into the picture to book a first down on the 11.

Webb then drove off left tackle, cut back and went over for the tally. The attempted placement was a fizzle.

Sparta gained but one first down and that in the second chapter—only fifty yards by rushing. Coach Claude Austin's underlings attempted 11 passes but clicked in none, which throws some light on the impotency of their offensive.

CASTEEL INJURED

Lawrenceburg, which lost its star fullback and captain, Phil Casteel, in the second quarter, registered eleven first downs, 195 yards by rushing and 72 yards on four of the eight passes tossed.

Sparta's big, lumbering eleven never threatened. The nearest the Spartans approached the stripe was the Wildcats' 29 yard line. This resulted from a pass interception by J. O. Kimsey in the last chapter.

Monitor Emerson Hendrix' outfit moved to the Sparta 22 in the second period, and came back in the third to parade to the 40. During the interim each club's offensive was confined to its own territory and midfield, with the punting of Kimsey and Webb and Lindsey featuring.

WEBB WHOLE SHOW

Webb was the whole show for the winners. He toted the leather 26 times and finished with a net total of 105 yards. Bill Willard and Pettus were also handy on the offensive.

Selph, Remke, Whitmore and Springer were the standout performers in Lawrenceburg's better than mediocre forward wall.

Sparta, which disappointed the crowd in general and its backers in particular, depended on Kimsey and he responded nobly. He averaged 34 yards on kicks, some of which were into a brisk wind. What yardage Sparta was able to achieve from scrimmage was attained by Kimsey.

Floyd Cooley, Barker Sims, Cliff Broyles, John Taylor, Joe Griscom, James Irwin, Charley Herd, George Richards and Frank Goddard were the other Sparta satellites.

During the intermission, bands from Middle Tennessee Teachers College, Murfreesboro Central High and Lawrenceburg strutted to plaudits from the crowd.
