

In the opener yesterday afternoon. Memphis South Side parlayed seven hits and six Elizabethton errors into an 8 to 1 win Righthander Don Gaines gave up only two hits, both singles, to gain credit for the win.

Tullahoma, the home team, never got another chance to catch the Weststate runnerup after pushing across a pair of runs in the bottom of the sixth. Rain halted the game before Covington could come up in the seventh.


Bobby Rose, the slender South Side righthander, gave up only five hits and struck out 11 men.


South Side pushed across single tallies in the second third, fifth and sixth innings to overcome a firstinning advantage held by Johnson City.

Jimmy Gartrell singled to left, scoring Aubry Pollan in the third with what proved to be the winning run. Johnson City's lone run came in the top of the first on a walk to Bobby Ellis, a sacrifice by Buddy Berry and Joe McClain's ground single over second.

South Side tied the count in the bottom of the second on a walk to Dennis Wann and Tommy Reed and a single by Sonny Gross. The Memphis team scored insurance runs in the fifth and sixth frames.
