Wildcats Fall To Covington

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Covington jumped on Tullahoma's ace left-hander Tommy Burnett for six runs in the top of the sixth inning to sink the Wildcats 7 to 3 in the TSSAA State baseball tournament here last night.

In the opener yesterday afternoon, Memphis South Side parlayed seven hits and six Elizabethton errors into an 8 to 1 win. Righthander Don Gaines gave up only two hits, both singles, to gain credit for the win.

Tullahoma, the home team, never got another chance to catch the Weststate runnerup after pushing across a pair of runs in the bottom of the sixth. Rain halted the game before Covington could come up in the seventh.

Covington, Weststate runnerup, and South Side, the champion, meet for the second time in two weeks in the finals of the state tournament here at Bellevue park tonight at 8 p.m.

South Side Captures Prep Baseball Crown

MEMPHIS — (AP) — Memphis South Side grabbed two quick runs in the first inning off John Hunter's homer and went on to trim Covington, 3-2 last night to win the Tennessee high school baseball championship.

Bobby Rose, the slender South Side righthander, gave up only five hits and struck out 11 men.

Covington tied up the game in the bottom of the fifth. Jere Hill lived on Bob Armistead's error and Wayne Robbins singled. Hill scored on Gaylon Beasley's double but Robbins was put out in a rundown after he tried to go home on the double. Beasley scored on Hugh Waits single.

South scored what proved to be the winning run in the sixth when Hunter walked, went to second on Beasley's error and scored on Fred Hearn's single.

MEMPHIS—(AP)—Don Goad set Johnson City down on three hits here last night as Memphis South side stopped the Hilltoppers, 4 to 1, to win the State high school baseball championship.

South Side pushed across single tallies in the second third, fifth and sixth innings to overcome a first-inning advantage held by Johnson City.

Jimmy Gartrell singled to left, scoring Aubry Pollan in the third with what proved to be the winning run. Johnson City's lone run came in the top of the first on a walk to Bobby Ellis, a sacrifice by Buddy Berry and Joe McClain's ground single over second.

South Side tied the count in the bottom of the second on a walk to Dennis Wann and Tommy Reed and a single by Sonny Gross. The Memphis team scored insurance runs in the fifth and sixth frames.
