## Nat Homers Spill Tigers

DETROIT (AP) — Home runs by Fred Valentine and Dick Phillips powered the Washington Senators to a 6-2 victory over the Detroit Tigers last night.

Only 4,351 fans, the smallest night crowd in Detroit history, watched as the Tigers lost their fifth straight
