Socha Wins 4th State Golf Title

4-Year Sweep Sets National Record

CHAPEL HILL, Tenn. — It may

CHAPEL HILL, Tenn. — It may have rained on Karen Socha's parade, but her enthusiasm wasn't dampened in the least.

Socha, a 17-year-old Greeneville High School senior, set a national high school record yesterday when she won her fourth straight Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association State Golf Tournament individual championship.

Socha posted a 27-hole total of 117 in the rain-shortened tournament. After shooting 7-over par 80 on the Buford Ellington Golf Course on Tuesday, the talented Socha matched par 37 on the back side yesratched par 37 on the back side yes-terday in the only nine she managed to complete. Memphis Hutchison's Kris Meyer, who matched Socha's 80 on Tuesday, had a 3-over 40 yester-

day.

Hixson of Chattanooga won the girls team title with a 260 after having a 173 through 18 holes. Father Ryan held onto second with a 264 total, one stroke in front of Memphis Southern Baptist Educational Center.

The rain which began early and increased in intensity throughout the day forced the boys competition to revert back to Tuesday's scores because not all players were able to complete nine holes yesterday. That left Knoxville Farragut and Chatta-

nooga Notre Dame tied for the indi-vidual championship at 304 and Rob-by Ware of Memphis Harding the in-dividual champion with a par 72. "I'm really excited. I've been

dreaming about this day ever since my freshman year, but I never thought I'd see the day it would hap-pen," said Socha, who has yet to de-

pen," said Socha, who has yet to de-cide on a choice of colleges.
"I knew all day that the weather would be a problem. I was on the practice green at about 6:15, and I could just feel that it was going to rain today and it started after I had played seven holes. I don't feel bad about it being shortened by rain. Cut-ting it short could have burt me as ting it short could have hurt me as much as it did anyone else." Socha, playing in the first four-some, continued after making the

turn and her score reflected the effects of the weather. She went double-bogey, bogey, bogey before a one hour, 20 minute rain delay was called. After returning to the course she continued to have trouble, but so

did the rest of her foursome.

Looking to next year is the Father
Ryan girls team, which had its highest ever state finish.

"This was not what we wanted, but the girls did the best they could,"

Yesterday's round marked the

second straight year that the state tournament has been shortened because of rain.

"You can't control the elements, and this is something we live with," said Ronnie Carter of the TSSAA.

"The students all miss three days (of classes) as it is, and missing more is too much to ask. You can't keep a golf course tied up forever, and you can't tie up a motel when you don't know if you're going to need it either." ◀
